### Risks vs. Hazards: Why is Risky Play important and when is it too dangerous?

**Wednesday January 17, 2018 Time: 6:30 pm - 8:30 pm 2 hours**

Come learn about why it is so important for children to take risks while they are growing and developing.

We will explore how to help children learn to identify, discuss and manage risks to support their physical, social and emotional development. We will discuss how educators can know when things are just too risky as well as how to spot the hazards and remove them from your environment.

#### Objectives:

- Discuss the importance of risk taking for healthy child development.
- Understand the difference between risks and hazards.
- Explore the difference between healthy risks and just plain dangerous activities.
- Learn how to develop Risk Management Policies for your organization.

We will focus on ways of introducing objects at hand with a focus on movement and aesthetics.

In this workshop participants will engage in lots of group discussion and reflect on their inclusive practice. Participants will review the BC ECE list of competencies, ELF and Reggio practice around the principles of relationship based guidance. Participants will also be given evidence based resources to support the ideology of relationship building, to better understand and support inclusion of all children.

### Objectives:

- Review the BC ECE list of competencies, ELF and Reggio principles around relationship building and inclusive practice.
- Explore relationship building principles and appreciate why these are important to better support children with challenging behaviours.
- Learn about evidence based resources that support an inclusive environment in early learning.

## Duty to Report: Responding to Child Care Welfare Concerns

**Wednesday January 31, 2018 Time: 6:30 pm - 8:30 pm 2 hours**

Child abuse is one of the most serious problems facing our society. Abused children suffer and the damage lasts a lifetime. Even worse, it can extend to future generations as patterns of abuse and neglect repeat themselves. That's why it's so important to know the signs of abuse and neglect and to take the right action when we see them. Come and learn what steps we can take to keep children safe.

### Objectives:

- Learn how to respond to child welfare concerns.
- Explore indicators of different types of abuse and harm experienced by children.
- Understand how to respond when a child or youth makes a disclosure.
- Determine how and when to report welfare concerns.
