Social and Emotional Learning Foundations

Wednesday April 3, 2019 Time: 6:30 pm - 8:30 pm 2 hours

This workshop will allow educators to develop their understanding of social and emotional learning (SEL). This is an introductory workshop for all practitioners and parents. Together we will explore the 5 domains of SEL and practices to explicitly teach SEL skills.

- Develop an understanding of embedding Social Emotional Learning into all areas of our programs.
- Highlight free or low cost Social Emotional Learning resources for diverse needs and ages.

Neighborhood Emergency Preparedness Program

The Neighborhood Emergency Preparedness Program (NEPP) is a program from the City of Vancouver to teach the public emergency preparedness. This session will teach you how to be prepared for any emergency or disaster you may be faced with, whether you are at home or work. You will learn personal and family preparedness, what to do when disaster strikes, how to connect with your family afterwards (if you are not together), how to perform a "home/office hazard hunt", and how to prepare your pets.

Objectives:

- Prepare for earthquakes and other hazards.
- Prepare for emergencies with your family, children and pets.
- Learn how to minimize hazards in your home and prepare for emergencies in an apartment.

★ Suitable for students, parents, adult instructors/administrators, novice, intermediate and experienced early care and learning professionals working with children of all ages, from infant/toddlers to school age children, including children with extra support needs.

Presenter: An approved facilitator from NEPP. NEPP instructors are a specially trained group of volunteers with the Vancouver Volunteer Corps. They're not only knowledgeable in emergency preparedness, but actively train and provide their knowledge and skills to real life emergency situations with the City.

Understanding Children's Behaviour: A Positive Approach to Guidance

Parents and families come to our programs from a wide range of experiences and with different perspectives. During this practical workshop we will discuss the importance of partnering with parents, creating open communication practices and developing strategies with parents to promote positive behaviour in preschool aged children.

Affect Regulation for Caregivers

Saturday May 11, 2019 Time: 10:30 am – 3:00 pm 4 hours

This workshop explains the neuroscience and neuropsychology of emotion, the differences between types of affect, and how several researched methods can be modeled and used for regulation. Discussion will center on how educators can model, create, and teach positive affect to improve a child's overall well-being and learning.

Objectives:

- Explore the neuroscience and neuropsychology of the function of emotion.
- Discuss emotion regulation and health.
- Learn strategies and skills to create better emotion regulation.
- Recognize strategies on modeling, creating and teaching positive affect to children.

★ Suitable for students, parents, adult instructors/administrators, novice, intermediate and experienced early care and learning professionals working with children of all ages, from infant/toddlers to school age children, including children with extra support needs.

Presenter: Dr. Kathryn E. Patten. Dr. Kathryn (Kate) E. Patten is an adjunct professor at Simon Fraser University. Her Ph.D. elucidates the neuroscience and neuropsychology of emotion and its impact on teaching. As the director of the Neuro Emotional Literacy Program (NELP), Kate's current research focuses on improving emotional literacy in order to promote emotional and physical well-being in families.

Origami: When the Paper Folds, the Mind Unfolds

Wednesday May 15, 2019

Time: 6:30 pm - 8:30 pm 2 hours

According to research, the manipulation of paper in Origami (the art of paper folding) is an activity that engages the whole brain. When both hands are engaged, motor impulses activate the language portion of the brain, also stimulating the prefrontal cortex which regulates memory and other cognitive functions like self-regulation. Origami is an excellent way for children to discover the principles of math, geometry, sequencing, spatial relationships, sequential memory and reading. Best of all, all it requires is one small sheet of paper!

Objectives:

- Learn simple origami that 5 year olds to school-age children may be able to make by themselves.
- Practice making origami animals that can be used in storytelling.

★ Suitable for students, parents, adult instructors/administrators, novice and intermediate early care and learning professionals working with 5 year olds to school age children.

This workshop helps carers to discuss age appropriate Sex Ed in different environments.

- Increase our comfort and competency with teaching and talking about sexuality, bodies, gender and boundaries.
- Understand how to coach and counsel children on appropriate body science words, boundaries, public vs private behaviours, gender and language.
